With the support of the project team members and experts, the selected youth will conduct activities aiming to document discrimination cases in their communities. The purpose of the activity is to collect and analyse crucial information on the situation in the respective societies. The findings will serve the base for the Curriculum for work with youth at risk. The Curriculum will be published and disseminated at the end of the project.	5	Serbia

Simultaneously, the societies in the region are not keeping pace with new digital tendencies, and there is a lack of media literacy and innovative curricula for new generations. The project aims to replace the mentioned social mechanisms and take over a significant portion of social space, through informal education, activist campaigns and media production. The project activities include lectures, movie screenings on relevant issues and study visits and sessions with experts such as psychotherapists.	1	Serbia

Therefore, the project proposal aims to investigate the challenges and consequences of COVID-19 pandemic on youth entrepreneurship in the Western Balkans to accumulate knowledge of best policy-initiated practices to help entrepreneurs overcome the crisis. In this regard, it aims to assess the pandemic's impact on entrepreneurial activity and influence multi-stakeholder advocacy action for supporting entrepreneurship policy during the crisis. The participants will go through a series of online trainings and mobility exchanges that will ensure dynamic discussions and interactivity. The COVID-19 challenges will be overcome by online platforms and organizing online consultations and sessions. The sessions have the goal to enable students to master life skills that will help them protect themselves from violence, such as communication skills, skills for a nonviolent problem and conflict resolution, development of critical thinking, and strengthening self-esteem.	1	Serbia

Macedonia, the Roma and Egyptian communities are facing extreme poverty, socio-economic marginalization and constant discrimination, particularly in education, social protection, health care, etc. On the regional level, there has been little to no institutional perspective and dialogue among minorities. Initiating dialogue among youth to share and face their problems is the project's primary goal, as well as identifying and exchanging good practices in fighting discrimination against vulnerable and marginalized youth. Secondly, it aims at enabling Roma & non – Roma youth and other minorities to jointly develop and lead quality youth work projects which contribute to the intercultural acceptance of diversity in local communities and further develop their competences. The envisaged activities include workshops, research on intercultural dialogue, a report mapping the current situation, radio podcasts and a summer school.	1	Albania

The project identifies the importance of raising awareness of Western Balkan's rich cultural heritage and envisages to do so through a platform where peers and other stakeholders will discuss possibilities of restarting tourism after the COVID-19 pandemic. The project aims to break tourism behaviour patterns and encourage people to explore new places in the region. The project activities include producing a podcast channel featuring alternative narratives through 6 different stories of young people from each of the three CP's participating. The project's approach is focused on skill development among young people that would enhance their employability chances. The idea is to use the economic aspect to achieve a closer social interaction between the young people of Kosovo* and Serbia. The project aims to strengthen collaboration, reconciliation, and intercultural cooperation by organizing numerous training sessions focused on soft and technical skills where youth work together on business ideas of shared interest. Experienced trainers will design a tailor-made online assessment for the participants and invest in their particular needs. Training sessions will be held focusing on various skill sets such as developing project ideas, pitching etc. Around 100 participants will take part in the training sessions, which will then be divided into ten groups required to come up with ten innovative ideas in different fields and write business plans.	1	Kosovo

According to surveys, youth in the region have low levels of political engagement and weak intercultural skills. The project wants to address the gap among young populations of the region as well as their distance from social engagement and the overall process of reconciliation. A Regional Summer School on multidimensional aspects of democracy and identity among youth in Western Balkans will be organized to discuss the above findings. Also, the creation of a brochure with shared experiences and good practices will be designed and shared.	3	Montenegro

21681953	Helsinški odbor za ljudska prava u Srbiji (Helsinki Committee for Human Rights in Serbia)	1	Challenge History – React for the Future	The COVID-19 pandemic has worsened young people's situation throughout the WB region and further weakened their potential to contribute to both internal social cohesion and regional cooperation. The isolation impacts their mental health and further dulls their motivation for social engagement. The planned project activities include developing the summer school program bringing together 30 high-school students from the CPs to address conflicting issues regarding the region's history. The Summer School will be based on four modules: the legacies of the Yugoslav wars; contrasting/shared historical narratives; a common heritage of the post-Yugoslav states, culture of remembrance. Learning sessions will involve classic and on-site lectures. Theatre workshops will involve participants in an open-ended discussion. Site visits will involve cultural and historical places near Kovacica that speak about the place's multicultural background and different layers of history. And lastly, the activities will close with a dynamic media campaign.	5	Serbia
